

## SBYIR Citation Guidelines

### ***General Citation Formatting:***

- Citations are listed (and numbered) in the order in which they appear in the piece, *not* in alphabetical order.
- In text citations are done in the following format: (Source #)
  - For example, if the sentence “The dogs were playing fetch” was the first thing taken from an outside source, the in-text citation would be as follows:

When we got to the park there was so much to see. The dogs were playing fetch (1). There were people laying by the pond.

### ***Formatting for Specific Sources:***

- *Journal Articles found online:*
  - Author(s), Article title. Journal name Volume Number, Pages (Year). doi: doi number.
  - Author names are formatted “First Initial. Last Name”.
  - If there are more than three authors, only the first is listed followed by et al..
  - Example: D. Jameson, et al., This is a sample citation. Stony Brook Young Investigators Review 8, 23-25 (2017).
  
- *Websites:*
  - Author(s), Article title. Website name, (Year).
  - Author names are formatted “First Initial. Last Name”.
  - If there are more than three authors, only the first is listed followed by et al.,
  - Example: G. Filiano, Study shows sharkskin increases drag by 50 percent. Stony Brook Newsroom, (2016).
  
- *Images:*
  - All that is needed to cite is the URL.
  - Example: Image retrieved from:
